The "Copper Tower"

Plesner's domicile, the "Copper Tower", is designed by Arkitema Architects and was built in 2004. The building is 62 metres high with 16 storeys.

During the "Pre-Moot", the oral arguments will primarily take place on 15th and 16th floor with stunning views.

Structure of the Pre-Moot

Rounds of Argument

The Plesner Pre-Moot 2023 will serve as preparation for the oral arguments in the 30th Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot, and the Pre-Moot will thus be based on the problem of the Vis Moot and will otherwise be conducted under the same rules as applied in the Vis Moot. The participating arbitrators in the Pre-Moot (three in each panel similar to the elimination rounds) will all be experienced practitioners in the field of international dispute resolution.

During the Pre-Moot, each team will conduct five rounds of oral argument (similar to the “General Rounds” in Vienna) and a final (sixth) round for the two best teams (similar to the “Elimination Rounds” in Vienna). Each team will plead at least twice as Claimant and twice as Respondent in the first five rounds.

The two teams with the highest overall scores for the first five rounds will meet each other in the finals (round six), which this year will take place in our auditorium with the other participants as an audience to mirror the finals in Vienna.

Scoring & Feedback

In the first five rounds, all teams will be scored by the arbitrators similar to the scoring system used in Vienna for the “General Rounds”. There will be no scoring in the final (sixth) round, as the arbitrators will choose the best team based on an overall assessment of their performance in the final round.

All teams will receive feedback from the respective arbitrators after each round of argument (apart from the final round). After the Pre-Moot, all team scores and individual scores will be sent to the respective teams.

Competition for Best Team

The two teams with the highest overall scores for the first five rounds will meet each other in the final round for first and second place. It will be decided by draw which team will plead as Claimant and Respondent in the final round. The third place will be awarded on the basis of the scores in the first five rounds. There will be prizes for the top-three teams, which will be announced during the reception at the end of the Pre-Moot.

Competition for Best Oralist

The oralist with the highest total score for three out of the first five rounds of argument (where there will be scoring) will win the prize for best individual oralist. In order to be eligible for this prize, an oralist must plead at least three times in the first five rounds and plead at least once as Claimant and once as Respondent. The applicable total score for an oralist will be the aggregate of the scores achieved in these three rounds. If an oralist pleads more than three times in the first five rounds (i.e., four or five times) the applicable score will be the aggregate between the three rounds in which the oralist has obtained the highest scores (and have pleaded at least once for each side). There is a prize for the winner(s), who will be announced during the reception at the end of the Pre-Moot.

You can also take the Metro (subway) from the airport to central Copenhagen - the fare is approximately DKK 30 and takes 15-20 minutes. You can then take a taxi or “S-train” to reach Plesner’s offices.
